

TBMH Music Tuition - Frequently Asked Questions Updated July 2020

1. Tuition

How do I choose an appropriate instrument for my child?

This can depend on various factors; which instrument(s) your child is interested in; how old they are; and how physically developed their bodies are (e.g. for wind/brass instruments front teeth are needed).

Can I choose tuition on any instrument?

Yes, provided that instrument is available at the ensemble or music school and we have a viable number of pupils wishing to learn that instrument at the time you apply. There may also be limitations on number of instruments available at the time of application.

My child wants to join an ensemble/choir; how do I know which one is suitable?

Generally, students will need to already be learning an instrument to join an ensemble. Choirs are grouped by age.

Ensemble	Tell me about this group?	Is there an audition?
Digital First Sounds	A first ensemble for pupils who have learnt a minimum of 5 notes on their instrument. This online ensemble aims to boost pupil knowledge of rhythm and pitch through musical games, as well as playing along to first pieces in a supportive environment. Resources will be available to use outside of sessions including video tutorials, backing tracks and practice parts. Some video footage of the experience may be put together to celebrate progress.	No
Digital Breakout Band	A flexible ensemble open to all instrumentalists Grades 2–4. Full recordings of repertoire, backing tracks and individual parts will be available for use outside of sessions. Each member will be asked to record themselves playing their part, culminating in a video performance being put together at the end of term.	No
Digital Symphonic Band	A flexible ensemble open to all advanced instrumentalists. Full recordings of repertoire, backing tracks and individual parts will be available for use outside of sessions. Some online rehearsals will be the full ensemble, and some will be instrument specific sectionals. Each member will be asked to record themselves playing their part, culminating in a video performance being put together at the end of term.	No

How about singing?

Choir	Tell me about this group?	Is there an audition?
Family Voices	Have fun singing together in this choir for all the family. You'll develop your voice, play musical games, and learn new songs to sing together. You'll be given resources to use outside of sessions, including tutorial videos, practice resources and backing tracks. You'll also take part in a recording project, culminating in a video performance at the end of term	No
	Develop your singing and musicianship skills and make new friends in our Junior Voices choir. You'll sing in unison and in harmony learning a wide range of songs, from traditional to pop. You'll be given resources to use outside of sessions, including tutorial videos, practice resources and backing tracks. You'll also take part in a recording project, culminating in a video performance at the end of term.	No
Next Level Voices	Develop advanced singing and musicianship skills in our Next Level Voices choir. The choir will perform a large range of repertoire in largely three-part harmony. Some rehearsals will be sectionals, and some will be full choir. You'll be given resources to use outside of sessions, including tutorial videos, practice resources and backing tracks. You'll also take part in a recording project, culminating in a video performance at the end of term.	No

How long is tuition for?

At present, this information relates to the Autumn term 2020. Tuition is for one term

What happens at the Saturday Music School?

Pupils access a lesson and/or a musicianship group.



Can my child have an individual lesson?

We don't recommend individual lessons to new starters; however, you may choose to have an individual lesson for some instruments at an additional cost. It is advised that students Grade 5 and above should apply for an Individual lesson.

Can I hire an instrument?

Yes. Any child attending our Saturday Music School or After School Ensembles may hire an instrument by completing a short form. Hire charges are £20 per term, with 50% remission available for eligible families. Parents are responsible for any accidental damage (but not normal wear and tear). Please note that we may not be able to lend certain uncommon or larger instruments (e.g. French horn, harp etc).

Can I watch my child's rehearsal?

In the current situation, parents/carers should be involved in being present during online learning.

How will I know how well my child is doing?

Annual end of year reports are written by each pupil's instrumental Tutor for pupils at Keyboard Centre, Cello Maestros and Saturday Music School. These are then sent out to parents at the end of the summer term. Pupils are also given a Practice Diary, through which their instrumental teacher can communicate with you each week over the course of their lessons, about what they need to practise each week and how they are progressing. Pupils in ensembles will not receive individual feedback.

Who will be teaching my child?

In addition to our core team, we have a pool of over 100 highly trained, experienced music tutors plus four Lead Instrumental Teachers, experts in teaching their instrument groups. At the first session of every academic year, there will normally be a short introductory session parents attend to go over plans for the year and health and safety, where you will be able to meet the teachers.

2. Applying

Where do I apply?

The application section of the website is **<u>HERE</u>**; which will take you to an online application portal.

I have submitted an application form online. When will I hear about my child's place?

Once we have received your application, we will place your child in their chosen tuition. If tuition is full, we will automatically add you to our waiting list. If your application was submitted halfway through a term, we will be in touch with you before the start of the next term to let you know if there is an available place for your child.

When can I apply for tuition in the Autumn Term (to start lessons from September)?

Applications for September will be processed during July/August. You will be contacted as soon as possible about your child's place. Late applications may be submitted, but we cannot guarantee a place for September.

How do I apply for concessions?

When completing the online application form, you will see details of the concessionary fees available. If your child is in receipt of free school meals, you are entitled to a 50% discount on tuition with the TBMH, provided you can give us a copy of their free school meals letter before being invoiced for tuition. There is more info in the Fees section below.

Is there a reduction for members of the same family?

Yes - if you are not already claiming the concessionary rate above, you can get a 50% on the cost of the second child for siblings attending the same tuition. More info in the Fees section below.

I live in another borough, but my child attends a Tri-borough school. Can we apply for lessons?

Yes – children need to either live in the Tri-borough area or attend a Tri-borough school, but it doesn't have to be both.

I live within the Tri-borough but my child attends school in another borough, can we apply for music lessons?

Yes - children need to either live in the Tri-borough area or attend a Tri-borough school.

3. Performances

What performance opportunities will be available to my child if I sign up?

In the current situation we will be preparing digital performances of the pilot ensembles and will share these in December. There will be no live in-person performances.

4. Cancellation

How and when can I cancel lessons?

Applications are for the whole term of tuition with the Tri-borough Music Hub and pupils are signing up for the complete term. If a pupil withdraws mind-term there will be no refund. Parents/carers are invoiced in advance.

How should I return the instrument once my child stops lessons?

You can speak to the administrator for the ensemble where the lessons take place. They will let you know a time to arrange to drop-off of the instrument(s) to our office at the Lyric Theatre, Hammersmith.



5. Fees / Payment / Remissions

Do you offer concessions?

We offer concessions for pupils who have proven eligibility for Free School Meals, and for pupils who attend the same Music Hub provision as their sibling.

Remissions Policy (Accessing Discounts for TBMH Activities)

The TBMH heavily subsidises the costs of all our activities to offer value for money to families and to enable equal access. On top of these subsidised prices, families can access up to a maximum of 50% remissions off the cost of TBMH activity if they qualify within any of the following categories:

* Free School Meals

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- * Ever 6 Free School Meals (in receipt of free school meals in the last 6 years)
- * Looked After Children
- * Post-Looked After Children (children who have been adopted from care or left care)

* Service Children (Ever 6 service child FTE or in receipt of pensions under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme [AFCS] or the War Pensions Scheme [WPS])

In all cases proof of entitlement will be required before provision starts. You can find out about applying for free school meals **here**

Families who do not fall into the above categories can still benefit from a 50% discount for siblings attending the same activity (e.g. both siblings attend are in the same choir)

Please note only one subsidised discount can be applied per applicant, up to a maximum of 50% remissions of fees (per pupil).

Instrument Hire and Charging

- Instruments can be hired from the TBMH at a charge of **£20 per term**. Remissions also apply to this charge.
- Instrument hire costs will be added to the termly invoice.
- Parents/carers are invoiced each term in advance by rbkc.invoicing@hants.gov.uk

Class Information

- All provision must be booked using the online portal
- Classes normally run 10 weeks each term, in term-time.
- Our Music School, Choirs, and Ensembles are delivered and run by fully qualified, DBS checked, and skilled tutors employed by the Tri-borough Music Hub (TBMH).
- Events/performances may be photographed/filmed. If you do not wish you child to be photographed/filmed then please inform the ensemble leader.
- It is essential that all up to date contact information is provided, in case of an emergency.

Do you offer a sibling discount?

We offer a 50% discount for the second sibling when attending the same provision (i.e. in the same choir or ensemble). *Please note these concessions do not stack – the maximum discount is 50% per child if claiming concessions and 50% for the second child only if claiming the sibling discount.

How do I pay?

As part of the Council we use their finance systems, which are currently outsourced to Hampshire Council. This means that you will be emailed an invoice via Hampshire before the start of each term to pay for your child's provision. These invoices will be sent from rbkc.invoicing@hants.gov.uk – we recommend you add this email address to your safe senders list after completing the online application form. Please note places are not secured until payment is made, and your child's place will be withdrawn if you do not pay subsequent invoices promptly.

Can I pay for my child's tuition with childcare / Kiddicare vouchers?

Unfortunately, we are unable to accept these or similar vouchers as a form of payment.
