We encourage pupils from all backgrounds to join our musical activity whether it is a choir, instrumental ensemble, Saturday Music School or any other musical opportunity. We work with pupils with a range of needs and experiences, and our tutors are trained as inclusive music educators. Through our wider programme, 'Musical Senses', the TBMH is committed to supporting young people who may have a sensory difference - vision impairment/blindness, or who are deaf or hard of hearing. Please do know that the TBMH is here for all children and young people, and that we will work hard to make each child feel valued and included with their music-making.

Instrumental Ensembles

Breakout Band

Mondays 4:30pm-5:30pm

Exploring different genres of fun repertoire for all instrumentalists who know at least 5 notes on their instrument to students working towards Grade 5. Pupils will be encouraged to develop ensemble skills such as balance, tuning and style through fun and accessible repertoire.





Large Group Guitar Class

Mondays 4:30pm—5:30pm

Explore exciting repertoire for guitar and learn to play with others as part of a large ensemble. This group is suitable for those who have been learning for at least 2 terms and can play at least 5 notes. Open to students in year 2 and above.

Symphonic Band

Wednesdays 5:00pm-6:15pm

An advanced, flexible ensemble open to all advanced instrumentalists who are playing at a minimum of Grade 5 to Grade 8+. The aim of this ensemble is to challenge pupils to develop the most intricate skills of playing in an ensemble.

Choirs



First Voices

Tuesdays 4:15pm-5:00pm

For children in year 1 and year 2 only. No previous experience is required, just a love of singing!

Together you'll learn a wide range of fun songs, rounds and musical games, and by the end of the term you will have increased confidence when singing and have developed your musical skills.

Junior Voices

Thursdays 4:30pm-5:30pm

Develop your singing and musicianship skills in our Junior Voices choir for children in school years 3-6. You'll sing in unison and in harmony, having fun singing together while learning a wide range of songs from folk to musical theatre to pop.





Next Level Voices

Tuesdays 5:15pm-6:30pm

Develop advanced singing and musicianship skills in our Next Level Voices choir for students in school years 7-13. The choir will learn a range of repertoire from contemporary to classical in largely three-part harmony, with tuition on music reading and sight singing included in the sessions.

Cello & Keyboard

Keyboard Classes

Thursdays 4:30pm-5:15pm (Beginners) & 5:30pm-6:15pm (Continuers)

Keyboard Classes are for complete beginners (class 1) or pupils who have been learning for around 1 or 2 terms (class 2). Pupils can expect to learn how to play simple pieces in a fun and supportive environment with a focus on learning the basics of technique, rhythm and musical notation. Year 3-9 only.





Cello Maestros

Wednesdays 3:30pm-6:00pm & Fridays 4:30pm-6:30pm (30-minute lesson)

Available as individual or paired 30 minutes lessons for pupils of all abilities. Spaces are subject to availability and pupils in paired lessons will be matched as closely as possible according to ability. Pupils will be expected to practice between lessons.

Music Production Classes



Music Production using GarageBand

Tuesdays 4:15pm-5:00pm

The main objective of this course is to learn how to confidently and efficiently use GarageBand for IMac to create beats and compositions, and how to mix and balance the different instrumental elements into a final product.

This course is open to year groups 5-7.





Music Production using Logic Pro X

Tuesdays 5:00pm-6:00pm

This is a unique opportunity to learn a powerful piece of software used by industry professionals, participants will have the opportunity to learn new, transferable skills and collaborate with like-minded creatives. This course is open to year groups 8-13.

Remissions

The TBMH heavily subsidises the costs of all our activities to offer value for money to families and to enable equal access. On top of these subsidised prices, families can access up to a maximum of 50% remissions off the cost of TBMH activity.

You can access 50% with proof of any of the below:

- Eligibility for Free School Meals at a state school in the Tri-borough area (means tested)
- Ever 6 Free School Meals (means tested receipt of free school meals in the last 6 years)
- Looked After Children
- Post-Looked After Children (children who have been adopted from care or left care)
- Service Children (Ever 6 service child FTE or in receipt of pensions under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme [AFCS] or the War Pensions Scheme [WPS])

In all cases proof of entitlement will be required before provision starts. You can find out about applying for Free School Meals <u>here</u>.

You can access 25% discount for the second sibling when attending the same provision.



Overview of the TBMH Saturday Music School

- SMS at Latymer provides music lessons each term for over 200 young people aged 7 to 18.
- Families may choose from 30 minute lessons in musicianship, instrumental or vocal and 60 minute Choir or Ensemble classes.
- Places will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis.
 We always strive to provide the best timetables we can for all pupils to accommodate all levels for as many applicants as possible.

Saturday Music School Tuition

Small Group Lessons (3-4 pupils)
Ideal for beginner
instrumentalists and singers in
their first few years of learning.

Individual Lessons (1 to 1)

Ideal for more advanced students (grade 5 and above) who need more specialist attention from their teachers, particularly when preparing for exams.

Paired Lessons (2 pupils)

Ideal for beginner to intermediate students to learn together with another musician.

Saturday Music School Ensembles, Choirs & Musicianship

Ensembles

This is a fantastic opportunity for children learning an instrument to be able to play together with others in a larger group.

Musicianship/Music Theory

Students learn musical concepts, staff notation, harmony, music appreciation, ear training and more! These are 30-minute group lessons that provide a foundation for all musicians and are offered at all ability levels (beginner to advanced).

Choirs

Students who study singing will have the opportunity to join a choir to enjoy singing together within a larger group, exploring a wide range of repertoire.

Online Lesson Bundles

We are offering 10 x Individual (1:1)
Instrumental, Vocal or Theory
Lessons to be timetabled
between families and tutors, held
online via zoom. They will be taught
online by our fully trained TBMH
Tutors who will have received
Safeguarding training and hold a
full DBS certificate.
