


a) School Music Curriculum Leads CPD - Thurs 2nd Oct, 09:30 - 12:30

d) Music Mark Schools is Changing

In September 2025, Music Mark are launching the Music Mark of Recognition to replace the Music Mark Schools programme. Schools will be nominated by the Music Hub for either the Dedication & Improvement award or the Ambition & Quality award, and schools will agree to three pledges upon nomination. e) New ISM Frameworks for Curriculum, Pedagogy, and Assessment

Designed to support the delivery of music education in primary and secondary schools, these frameworks will help you plan and assess musical learning in your classroom. They can be used in a number of ways: for individual lessons, for medium-term planning, for long-term planning and supporting and evidencing children's musical learning and development over time. They are constructed upon sound research-based principles and evidence into effective teaching, learning and assessment in music.
